AHS and community blood drive

The students, staff and faculty of Avenal High School encourage the community to save lives by donating at a blood drive on Friday, February 17. Donors are invited to drop by the school, roll up their sleeve and give between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. All donors will receive a variety of discounts from valley businesses for dining, recreation, entertainment, and services.

“At this time of year, blood usage is high, due to weather related accidents, and donations are often lower due to the flu season,” said Chris Sorensen, Director of Community Relations and Development for Central California Blood Center. “We rely heavily on our loyal donor base, but must encourage new donors, even more, to meet the ever-growing need for blood. Anyone who is healthy and meets the eligibility requirements is needed to please give blood.”

Blood donation takes less than one hour to complete. Donors must be in good general health, weigh a minimum of 110 pounds and be at least 17 years old (16 years old with written parental con-

sent). Senior citizens are encouraged to donate, as there is no upper age limit. Donors should eat a good meal and drink plenty of water within 4 hours prior to their donation. Donors can give blood every eight weeks. Photo ID and Social Security Number are required at donor registration.

The Central California Blood Center is the sole provider of blood and blood products for the 31 hospitals in Fresno, Tulare, Madera, Kings and Mariposa Counties and must collect between 5,000 to 6,000 pints of blood a month to meet the needs of our Valley community.

Coaches vs. Cancer fundraiser at WHCC

West Hills College Coalinga will host its Second Annual Coaches vs. Cancer Fundraiser on Wednesday, February 8th at 5:00 p.m. The Falcons will play Columbia College.

“Coaches vs. Cancer is a great program,” said Mark Gritton, athletic director at West Hills College Coalinga. “Our basketball coaches and team are excited to help make a difference in the fight against cancer,” added Gritton.

West Hills College Coalinga held its first Coaches vs. Cancer Fundraiser last year raising over \$900, coming in third in the state. This year the college hopes to raise even more money with the support of its community.

All proceeds from the game will be donated to Coaches vs. Cancer including the half time activity, “Falcon Flyers” where game attendees purchase pieces of paper to make paper airplanes to compete for Falcon memorabilia including t-shirts, visors, lanyards, etc.

Coaches vs. Cancer is a nationwide collaboration

between the American Cancer Society and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) with a nationwide effort to unite coaches across the county in the common mission to provide help and hope to all people facing cancer.

Not only does the program increase cancer awareness but it also promotes healthy living through year-round awareness efforts, fundraising activities, and advocacy programs.

More than 2,000 Division I, II, and III college coaches are involved in the program. Since the program’s inception in 1993, Coaches vs. Cancer has raised nearly \$50 million to support the American Cancer Society.

The game will be played in the gymnasium on campus. Admission to the game is \$6 general admission, \$4 for senior citizens and students are admitted for free.
